

Cookies Policy

Berry Ingredients (“we”) use cookies on berryfeedingredients.co.uk (the “Service”). By using the Service, you consent to the use of cookies.

What is a cookie?

Cookies are small pieces of text sent by your web browser by a website that you visit. A cookie file is stored in your web browser and allows the Service or a third-party to recognize you when you return to the site, to make your next visit easier and the Service more useful to you.

There are different types of cookies - "persistent" or "session" cookies.

How Berry uses cookies

When you use and access the Service, we may place several cookies files in your browser.

We use cookies for the following purposes:

- to enable certain functionality of the Service
- to store your preferences
- to provide analytics

We use both session and persistent cookies on the Service. We also use essential cookies to authenticate users and prevent fraudulent use of user accounts.

Third-party analytics

We also monitor our websites using Google Analytics and Facebook Impressions, which use cookies to report usage statistics.

What about social networks?

If you choose to 'share' Berry Ingredients content with friends through Facebook, Twitter or another social network you might be sent cookies from those websites.

As we do not control the setting of such cookies, please refer to those websites for information about their cookies and how to manage them.

What if I don't want to accept cookies?

If you wish to restrict or block the cookies which are set by any website, you should do this through the browser settings for each browser you use, on each device you use to access the Internet. However, you can allow cookies from specific websites by making them "trusted websites" in your Internet browser.

You may wish to decline cookies, which you can do by altering the settings on your browser. However if you do this you may find that you will be unable to access certain parts of our websites.
